- Grant approval authority – up to \$100,000 (level commensurate with responsibility and experience)

Background/Experience Desired (situational competencies/performance measures): Exceptional communications skills including ability to interact with a variety of external and internal audiences including senior management; steward of teamwork, collaboration and building relationships; experience with staff selection and development; strong financial management, analytical and strategic planning skills; values differences and diversity; knowledge of community/philanthropy as well as company's business.
